# The Big Commuter Survey – RESULTS!



Smart Journeys carried out their annual online commuter survey for two weeks from 14th October, ending midnight on Sunday 27th October 2024.

One of the core objectives of this annual commuter survey is to provide insight into the localised impact commuting has on the highway network and the environment over a one-week period.

The travel mode data also collected information on journeys away from the site (on business) and of those residents on leave. This is to portray a normal working week, and this proportion of residents is presented as 'other'.

The survey results provide a clear picture of the way Skylark residents travel to work, enabling Smart Journeys to gain a basic insight into the travel-related issues residents face getting to work, and to identify new travel and transport opportunities.

This data is also used by Smart Journeys to provide valuable insights to support with their sustainable travel initiatives, influence future public transport decisions across the county, and advise on public transport improvements around the local area. Results will also help steer on improvements to the transport network, ensuring that we focus on the most effective areas for both residents and businesses.

The goal is to support in making Cambridgeshire a greener, more sustainable place to live, by endeavouring to offer more accessible, safer, healthier, and reliable travel options. Travel and commuting habits have shifted in recent years and we want to learn more about how residents are now getting to and from work; equipping us to plan for enhancements, such as additional walking and cycling routes, along with better public transport facilities and infrastructure. We are also committed to achieving carbon net-zero by 2045, something we also know is important to Cambridgeshire residents, as highlighted in the recent Quality of Life survey. The travel survey in October 2024 enabled Skylark residents to contribute and share feedback.

Smart Journeys want to take this opportunity to thank all the Skylark residents who took the time to take part in this exercise.



#### **Survey Results**

A total of seven (7) respondents took part in the survey.

- Single occupancy car use was found to be the main mode of transport used to commute.
- Cycling.
- Walking.
- Bus and train travel is the least mode of transport used to commute.

#### **Barriers**

The survey revealed that a high number of residents generally experience barriers commuting more sustainably.

#### Walking

67% of Skylark survey participants find walking distance too far, with 33% saying it takes too long, and had concerns with personal, and road safety.

#### Cycling

50% of Skylark survey participants had concerns over theft of personal property/security, general personal security, and road safety. An additional concern raised was, "lack of cycle paths or pavements and that some of the roads are so narrow with ditches either side and having to compete with lorries and tractors is worrisome, especially for young children."

#### Carsharing

100% of Skylark survey participants felt carsharing was not reliable.

#### Bus (incl P&R)

67% of Skylark survey participants felt talking the bus took too long, with 33% taking buses were unreliable, more expensive than their usual form of transport, service does not go where they need, or leave when they need. The general concensus was a need for more bus routes through Wisbech and surrounding areas.

#### Train

100% of Skylark survey participants had concerns about personal safety and road safety when travelling to get the train.

#### E-Bike/E-Scooter

50% of Skylark survey participants felt accessing an e-bike or scooter was too far.

#### Survey - Next Steps

#### Bus

We have taken on board your feedback from the survey and have already started looking at alternative ways for residents to travel in around Wisbech by bus. We have been in and around conversations with alternative bus operators who could potentially offer a more flexible and tailored service, meeting the requirements of Skylark residents, to better support in faciltating a more effective interconnective day-to-day commute, or for recreational/leisure travel.



#### Tiger 7 (T7) Bus

Did you know that from 27th May seven brand new Tiger bus routes will be roaring into action across Cambridgeshire and Peterborough? These routes have been designed to better connect towns, villages, and communities – offering faster journey times, more frequent services, and improved reliability.

One of the new services is the planned Tiger 7 (T7) bus service, an hourly service that runs from Wisbech Horse Fair Bus Station to Chatteris East Park Street, Monday to Saturday from approximately 6am-8pm.

Whether you are commuting to work, heading to school or college, shopping in town, or visiting friends and family – there's a Tiger route for you.

#### Cycling

Smart Journeys are aware of the current challenges with limited cycling infrastructure available in the surrounding Skylark area and are continuing to look at better ways to enable safer and more accessible routes for all residents in the local area.

There are plans under the Local Cycling and Walking Improvement Plan (LCWIP) Schemes to implement enhancements in the area with links to Weasenham Lane employment area and the Town Centre. It is then likely that in the future, cycling would become a more attractive mode of transport. In addition, the plans for the new school in this area and new housing development on Sandy Lane which would potentially lead to some much-needed local enhancements on Weasenham Lane. Unfortunately, bike thefts are a significant issue in Cambridgeshire, particularly in Cambridge city center, with an estimated 9,000 thefts per year. Smart Journeys role is to guide



and inform bike owners on how to take stronger measures to keep their bikes safer and secure. Just some of the most important things to remember is, double lock your bike and register the frame number for tracking purposes in case of an unfortunate bike theft.

unassuming National Trust gem, the Peckover House and Garden, at North Brink, Wisbech PE13 1JR.

From the 1790s it was home to the Peckovers, a fascinating dynasty of Quaker bankers, collectors and philanthropists who created the spacious Victorian garden that lies behind the house.
